Much has happened during that time and sales of the book are fast approaching 500 copies. New branches of the family have been traced in Alaska, California and Massachusetts. A stray West Gore branch is featured in this issue with the hope that someone can provide the missing connection. Letters and obituaries complete the issue.

There has been a growing interest by medical researchers in the field of genealogy. While at the LDS Family History Library in Salt Lake. City last September I learned of an American doctor, Mark Skolnick, using family records to prove a genetic link with certain types of cancer. In another case, here in Nova Scotia a search is on among descendants of families from Musquodoboit to locate a bone marrow transplant donor. I have been working on this project as part of a team of genealogists tracing people all over Canada and the U.S. So far, despite hundreds of tests, we have not been able to find a matching tissue type to help the two girls; Katie and Kirsten Frohnmayer who are threatened by a rare bone disease.

Copies are now available at the Public Archives of Nova Scotia in Halifax and at the West Hants Historical Society library in Windsor. A total of 21,555 individuals are listed. REMINISCENCES

Reminiscences of the past - spent with my Aunts, Ruth and Gertrude (daughters of 14845-Mary Harvey and Alden Nunn) in Kelowna on November 24, 1987. By Constance Carston, Cranbrook B.C.

Grandma Harvey: Mary Elizabeth Brady

She was five foot and weighed two hundred-twentyfive pounds. (My mother always worried that she would become as fat as Grandma Harvey) She married Captain James Narroway Harvey.

Her personality was very sweet, a perfect picture of a perfect grandmother who thought you could do no wrong. She was like a little angel-like a fat little cherub.

Hobbies were knitting, quilting(prefered the log cabin pattern) and hooking rugs. During the war, she would knit a pair of socks every week. Ruth and Gertrude can still see her knitting away-with her

eyes closed.

She had seven children; Abigail-farm wife, Captain Frederick, Levi, Elvira-nurse who died at 35 with heart trouble, Mary(Bumba), (I'm afraid I couldn't say gramma, it came out Bumba and that name stuck with her for the rest of her life), Laura, (who died of heart trouble) and Wallace.

Her favorite saying was "your spine is to sit on not to hang your head on." They were terrified of getting consumption so posture was really stressed. Another saying was "You're running around like a fart

in a mitten looking for your ___ (shoes,books,coats,)
If Grandma Harvey ever fell down everyone rushed to help her up. She was so round from her weight that she couldn't get up by herself.

Grandpa Harvey: Captain James Narroway Harvey

Gertrude had a cat and Ruth had a dog. The dog and cat would lie on the threshold going into the dining room. Only their noses poked into the dining room. As soon as everyone was seated, their heads bowed and the blessing started, the cat would take off with the dog after it. Into the living room, over an entrance table, up the stairs, over the bed, down the stairs, over the table again and back with their noses on the threshold. All by the time "Amen" was said. This was a daily performance and Grandpa Harvey loved the dog and cat, but never showed it.

As he grew older he became quite a feeble man. He had problems walking and had to use a cane.

Obedience was his watchword. Everyone had to be quite as he tolerated no noise. Quiet activities were in order so everyone sat and did knitting, crocheting, hemstitching, drawn work, etc. Bedtime was at 9:00 p.m. Everyone went to bed.

My mother said that sometimes they would play a quiet game of cards on a small rug-if they heard anyone coming they could flip the rug and hide the

cards. Cards were not allowed in the house.

Fear of T.B. was so strong. During the summer, they slept outside on the porch. The wild cucumber and scarlet runner beans growing up the screens of the porch hid the beds from public view.

Grandpa Harvey had beautiful, very dark brown

eyes, red beard, and red hair.

He used to let Ruth get away with murder and with Gertrude, he was protective but silent even though he used to brag about her to other people.

Ruth- "He was a dear old man."

Gertrude- "He was a contankerous old buggar, not compatable with me. We had nothing in common but still we never quarreled.

At the Harvey home, everything was run by the clock. 8:00 a.m.-Breakfast, 12:15 p.m.-Lunch, and 5:00 p.m.-supper. Bumba would stand with her hand on the teapot, watching and waiting for the clock to bong. Everyone went into the dining room and the meal progressed-silently. Grace was said at every meal, "Lord bless ..", and no-one ever knew what he mumbled after those two words. Meals were served by him onto each plate. You were allowed to say "Please pass me the .. " and please and thank-you. You ate everything he put on your plate (except what you could hide on the ledge under the table).

When Grandpa Harvey spoke you said "Yes, Sir." He ran his home the same as he ran his ship. Sunday was a day of worship and you were allowed to read the bible. Meals were prepared the day before. Only the absolute housework needed to be done. No sweeping of

floors after 7:00 p.m.

SCOTTISH RESEARCH

This letter was contributed by Douglas Harvie of Dartmouth N.S.

Dear Mr. Harvie,

I first checked the date of the marriage of James Harvie (senior) and Margaret Boyle - which was recorded in the Old Parochial Registers of Dalry as follows: February 1735

James Harvie and Margt. Boyle both in this parish gave up their names for proclamation

6th. Married April 30th.

There were several other Harveys in the parish of Dalry registering children at the same time as James Harvey and Margaret Boyle - namely:

William Harvie in Birkhead

William Harvie - mason in Kirktown

William Harvie in Bradockles

John Harvie

Unfortunately the birth records are blank from 1698-1701 and from 1705-1724 and I found neither the birth of James Harvey, nor any other Harvey births recorded among the few entried which do exist for the years 1701-1705.

I next consulted the Index to Testaments registered in the Glasgow Commissariot and found four relating to Harvie in Dalry - as follows:

JOHN HARVIE in Wardlaw = testament registered 18th April 1671. He died in January of that year and his executor was William Harvie, his son.

JOHN HARVIE in Coalburn - testament registered 30th January 1672. He died December 1670, and his testament was given up by John Cochrane in

Quhystaines, his creditor.

JOHN HARVIE elder of Braidlie - testament registered

22 Apr 1672 - died February 1672. Testament given up
by Thomas Harvie, his son.

ROBERT HARVIE in Braidlie - testament registered 20th September 1608. He was married to Nancy Boyd with a brother named John. Robert Harvie's children were named Robert, William and Margaret. He also owed money to John Harvie in Coalburn.

Unfortunately, although it is clear that a number of Harvie families were living in Dalry, it is not possible to make any definite link-up with your ancestors who lived at Dogartland Mill.

According to the Directory of Landownership in Scotland 1770, Dogartlandmill belonged to Blair of Blair. I therefore searched the Index to these muniments which have been deposited in the Scotish Record Office. Among the papers. I found a Tact (lease) of the Mylne of Doggartland dated 30th Aug 1666 between the Rt. Hon. John Blair of that Ilk (the proprietor) and William Kelso in Kingdoge (the tenant) concerning "half of the Mill of Doggartland formerly possest by the said William Kelso and the other half presently possessed by Mathew Crawford, Smith.

The Harvies, therefore must have come to the Mill at some future date. I also consulted Rentals of the Blair family dated 1685, 1744, 1782 and 1785 but found no reference to the Harvie family in these papers.

Finally for interest I consulted the 1841 Census Schedules for Dalry and found that there were six families of Harvies living there - two farmers, two of independent means, a grocer and a cooper.

I do hope the enclosed report will be of interest to you.
